

SINGAPORE EXCURSIONS

OVERVIEW

There are so many things to do and see in Singapore despite it being a tiny country (only 1 hour from east to west by car!). At BlueSky we make sure that our students get to see as much as possible while they are with us whether they be here for 2 weeks or 5 days. Read on for a description of some of the main activities we do with the students. Activities can sometimes change from camp to camp but if your group has a special request for an activity then feel free to let us know when you book.

City Tour

Students explore Singapore on foot visiting the infamous Merlion park, Marina Bay Sands Hotel and, of course, Gardens by the Bay (see below). Gardens by the Bay is one of the world's best eco-tourism attractions and students can revel in the breath-taking scenery of the Marina Bay and Singapore skyline from here. When you visit you can understand why Singapore has been given the nickname 'The Garden City'! Students will also visit the local Hawker centre (food court) where they will get to try lots of the local cuisine and immerse themselves in Singaporean culture.



Chinatown

Singapore is a famous cultural melting pot. Comprising of Malay, Chinese and Indian cultures, the communities have lived together in harmony for centuries enjoying the freedom to express their respective cultural identities. The students will visit Chinatown, one of the most vibrant districts in Singapore. Here the students will experience a little taste of China and explore the shops and temples which dot every street corner. A chance to practice their English with English speaking shopkeepers and delight in the delicious aromas billowing from the traditional restaurants, this is a great way to get a real feel for Singaporean culture.



Adventure Cove Waterpark

Learning English at the equator can be hot and thirsty work! Our students will have a chance to cool off and relax with a trip to one of the world's best water parks. At Adventure Cove Waterpark, students can take high-speed water slides, laze the day away drifting on a lazy river and snorkel with 20,000 tropical fish.



Universal Studios Singapore

The premier attraction in Singapore and a draw for tourists from around the world - Universal Studios has something for everyone. Students will be entertained in shows, thrilled by rides. There are rides suitable for both the young and old depending how scary you want them to be!



Science Centre

With more than a thousand interactive exhibits spanning 14 galleries, Science Centre Singapore is an ideal space to inspire the next generation of Newtons or Einsteins. Trek to the centre of the earth through a crack in the surface to discover the different layers that lie beneath. Or power an engine just using the heat from your palm! These are just some of the fun activities that can be found at 20 permanent exhibitions at the Science Centre.



Singapore Zoo

Singapore Zoo has one of the most beautiful, natural settings of any Zoo, anywhere in the world. Nine-time winner of the coveted Best Leisure Attraction Experience award by the Singapore Tourism Board, Singapore zoo is nestled within the lush natural rainforest that includes lakes and rivers. More than 2,800 animals from over 300 species of mammals, birds and reptiles call Singapore Zoo home. Students can explore 'Australasia' 'Wild Africa' and view rare White Tigers, Chimpanzees and Elephants.



Skyline Luge

Skyline Luge can be found on Sentosa, Singapore's very own 'State of Fun'. Invented in New Zealand 33 years ago, the Skyline Luge is now located across 6 different international locations. Described as being similar to go-karting, the Luge has a purpose built track but relies solely on gravity and not engines to get its riders to travel from the top of the hill all the way to the bottom. Don't worry about getting back up though, there are cable cars which take you back to the top with incredible views over Sentosa and Singapore beyond.
